Creative Materials



Managing Materials

Communities often work with many kinds of data—recordings, videos, texts, stories, and so forth. With your guidance and vision, we can organize and manage these materials for long-term use, creating search-friendly, easy-to-use collections that keep everything protected and accessible for the future.

Community Archives

An archive is a carefully organized place—digital, physical, or both—where recordings, texts, stories, and other materials are collected, preserved, and made accessible for those who need them. We can work together to build an archive that keeps your language materials safe, organized, and fully in your community's hands.

Training

Workshops and hands-on guidance in recording techniques, equipment use, and practical workflows for capturing language in audio and video. Training also includes using software to transcribe, analyze, and organize materials, building skills that help your community document, manage, and preserve resources for years to come.

Making Language Accessible

Tools that make your language easier to access and engage with. This might include online dictionaries or interactive word-of-the-day features that help bring language into homes, classrooms, and community spaces. We can also adapt existing linguistic descriptions into clear, usable formats that make the structure of the language more understandable and useful for language learning.

Digital Access

Online Dictionary

An online dictionary makes your language more accessible to learners—offering not just word meanings, but rich connections to example sentences, stories, and recordings. You control access, and shape how the language is explored and shared.

Word of the Day Word of the Day is a simple, powerful way to spark daily

language use—whether through text, audio, or video. Each word invites learners to grow their vocabulary and stay connected to the language, one day at a time.

Website Development

A website offers a dynamic, flexible space for your language—far beyond what a typical app can do. Through collaborative effort, we can build a site that brings together a dictionary, encyclopedic knowledge, lessons, and interactive tools, all shaped by your community's goals.

Writing & Structure Access

Orthography Support

Whether you're working with an established writing system or refining one to better fit how your language is spoken, I offer support in shaping clear, consistent ways to represent your language in writing. We can develop easy-to-follow guides—linked to audio examples—to help understand and use your writing system with confidence.

Accessible Grammar

Have you ever read a grammar on your language and felt overwhelmed? You're not alone—many grammars are written by and for linguists, not for communities who speak and live the language every day. Together, we can turn that technical knowledge into a community grammar or visual guides that clearly explain the bones of your language and how it works.

Pronunciation Guide

Pronunciation can be complex, especially when sounds influence each other within a word or phrase. We can create clear, community-based guides—linked to audio from speakers and available in print or online—to support more accurate and confident language use.

Versatile Language Access

QR Codes

QR Codes present endless possibilities in language work, making language learning materials more accessible. These little squares can do big things. Scan them with a phone or tablet to instantly access audio recordings, videos, or interactive materials. Add them to books to hear a fluent speaker read aloud, place them on posters for quick vocabulary practice, or stick them around the house to bring language into daily life. They're a simple way to make your language resources more dynamic, mobile, and easy to share. Together we can create a QR code library linking to audio, video, and interactive resources that can be placed anywhere you desire.

Archive Research

Over the years, many people may have written down or recorded parts of your language—sometimes stored in libraries, universities, or personal collections that are hard to reach. I can help locate and access these historical records, documents, audio, and video, and work with archives to bring this knowledge back to your community. Whether it's navigating digital archives or helping digitize older materials, the goal is to make valuable resources accessible and usable for your language work today.

Digging Deep

Locating Historical Materials

Valuable pieces of your language's history may be tucked away—recordings, field notes, word lists, stories, or lessons documented years or even centuries ago, stashed in libraries, university collections, museums, or government archives. I can help investigate where these resources are held and help bring them back to you.

Recovering Records

I can help navigate archives located all over the country and beyond to locate and access valuable language materials. This includes working with institutions to request copies, clarifying permissions, and recovering information that has been stored away, to make these materials available for your community's ongoing language work.

Digital Access

Older or fragile materials—
like handwritten notes,
cassette recordings, or rare
printed texts—can be
preserved by converting them
into digital formats. I can
assist with scanning, audio
transfer, or video conversion,
then help organize these files
so they're clear, searchable,
and easy for your community
to access and share.

Wherever you are in the stages of developing your language program, I can help put your strategic plan into action—shaping initiatives such as classes, immersion programs, mentorships, or documentation projects. These steps are guided by your community's vision and capacity, turning plans and funding into meaningful, lasting impact.

Understanding How Your Community Uses Language

Language Surveys

A language survey helps your community see the full picture of how, where, and by whom the language is used.

Through interviews, questionnaires, or community conversations, it gathers information on strengths, needs, and goals—insights that guide planning, strengthen programs, and support decisions that keep the language thriving.

Social Networks

Your social network is all the people you talk to in your language. We can create visualization maps of these connections—who uses the language with whom and how often—that help your community see patterns of language use, identify strong areas, and spot places where language use could be strengthened.

Language Domains

A language domain refers to the spaces and situations where a language is used—home areas like the kitchen or bathroom, work settings, or social spaces like a community hall. Focusing on domains helps build language use around everyday routines and real contexts. We can develop the language for these spaces and strengthen its use in daily life.

Here's an outline to show some of the process of working together:

- Interest Form If you're interested, I can give you a form to fill out so I can get an idea of your language goals, needs, and interests.
- Initial Conversation We schedule a call or meeting to talk through ideas, priorities, timelines, and scope.
- Proposal & Estimate I send a detailed proposal with suggested services, timeline, and cost estimate.
- **Community Review** The community reviews the proposal and provides feedback, revisions, or approval.
- Contract & Agreement We draft and sign a clear, community-first agreement outlining responsibilities, deliverables, and rights.
- Work Begins We begin collaborating on the project, with regular check-ins to ensure the work aligns with your evolving goals.
- Community Ownership All materials remain under your ownership and control. I maintain regular communication, project updates, and full transparency throughout the project.
